Section 1.04.030 – City seal.

The corporate seal of the City of Edna Bay consists of two concentric circles bordered in black. The outer silver gray ring contains small black dots that surround the entire circle of the second layer. In the area between this circle and the next are the words “City of Edna Bay” across the top, in all capital letters with a medium sized black star at each end, and a black dot to the outside of the star. The mid-points of the outer circle are marked by a black salmon on each side with a small black dot at both ends. Centered across the bottom of this circle are the words “Est. 2014” with “Alaska” immediately below. A silver gray ring also surrounds the inner circle giving it definition and separation from the outer. The innermost area of the seal depicts an image of Edna Bay itself including the shoreline and mapped rock outcroppings. Upland areas are signified by thin diagonal black lines. Cultural symbols characteristic to the city are also illustrated in black and include a float- plane, fishing vessel, and nine evergreen trees. (See below)



Section 1.04.040 – Seal adoption declared.

The Edna Bay City Council declares the seal as described in Section 1.04.030 as the official symbol and corporate seal of the City of Edna Bay, Alaska.

Section 1.04.050 – Use of seal.

- (a) The city clerk is the custodian of the official seal of the city. The clerk affixes the seal to official documents executed on behalf of the city to certify or authenticate such documents.
- (b) The seal will be used in accordance with approval by the City of Edna Bay administrative authority.
- (c) The seal may be used as a logo on city stationary and additional documents produced by the city clerk or the Edna Bay City Council.
- (d) No person, including an officer or employee of the city, may affix the official seal or any facsimile thereof to any documents except as authorized and in accordance with law. The section, however, does not prohibit the adoption and use of unofficial seals, logos, trademarks or other identifying symbols to be used in the conduct of the business of the city.
