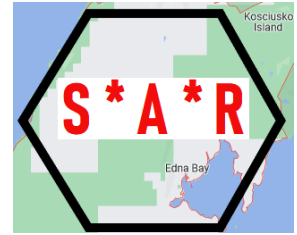


S*A*R September - Last go over of Roger's Presentation in July that was in writing:



1. We have made available the list and several documents created for presentation in 2022 at the store on the wall.

It doesn't seem to attract any attention or raise awareness.

A. Should we consider expanding the page on the City's Website to include the information that we post at the store? See attached.

Especially the Ready-to-Go that suggests that the concerned citizens of the city who want to be ready-to-go should pull together like-kind items mentioned in the full article from Jefferson County Search and Rescue in Washington State and keep them in a well-labeled duffel bag. <https://www.jsar.org/membership/gear/>

B. Should we **lamine** it and make a **larger board**?

C. Should we **mail** them out to each household at certain times of the year, December and June?

2. We are getting the equipment in from Amazon spurts.

A. Once they are collected it would be good to also collect the other **two fatigue-colored back packs; can someone commit to retrieving them?**

B. Then, we will store them in the rear of the 24' trailer on our property.

C. The radios are in the cabin temperature and electronically maintained.

3. My conclusion of the legalities that were mentioned in July's meeting about Edna Bay having a SAR Chair (some requiring **action**):

A. Cities are not allowed to form SARs. They are only certified by Alaska Public Safety.

B. Looking at the City's Website

1) It would be best to change the chair title to **SAR Equipment Manager**

2) It would be best to say that the city has some SAR equipment available and try to keep a current list the components in each of the six back packs.

3) It would be best to recommend that concerned citizens become familiar with the JSAR gear group list posted at the store and the Website information for the PDF.

4) It would be best to make people aware of the city's limitation:

- The City and the Equipment Manager will not be responsible for any other aspect of a SAR event
- The City and the Equipment Manager will not be legally responsible for any authority contact
- The City and the Equipment Manger will not be responsible to gather any information of the who, what, where, why and when of the situation

5) It would be best to explain how equipment is disbursed.

- The Equipment Manager will note what is borrowed, the date, and who has the equipment.
- The city will expense the refurbishment of the equipment exhausted.

4. Recap, this is what the city won't be doing:

A. There will be no distributing policy other than noting who, what, when the equipment is loaned to

B. There are no qualification to who borrows the equipment other than it to be used for SAR activity

C. The borrower is responsible for signing out and signing in the equipment
